- Believes patients and their families should not be burdened with additional expenses as life limiting illness occurs.



How do I know if Palliative Care is right for me?

If you suffer from pain, stress or other distressing symptoms due to a life-limiting illness such as cancer, heart disease or lung disease, palliative care might be right for you.

You may continue curative or aggressive therapies.

Palliative Care

Services provided:

- Nursing visit twice a month and additional visits as needed
- Nursing service available 24/7 for emergencies
- Social worker visits
- Chaplain visits
- Information on advanced care planning

Where do I receive Palliative Care?

Palliative Care is provided in your home or place of residence.

***You DO NOT have to be homebound.**

What is cost of Palliative Care?

There is no charge for Palliative Care services. Funding comes from private foundation and donations.

About North Central Palliative Care:

- NCPC is under the umbrella of Hospice of North Central Oklahoma.
- Service area includes 50-mile radius area north to Kansas border, south to the Red Rock area, east to Shidler/Fairfax area and west to Nardin/Deer Creek/Lamont.
- Uses Interdisciplinary Group (IDG) composed of professionals including
 - *Attending Physician
 - *NCPC Medicare Director
 - *Nurses
 - *Social workers/Social service specialists
 - *Chaplains
- Develops and coordinates a plan of care with physician, patient and the patient's family/caregivers and review monthly as needed.
